Scope

The Bilingual Health Promotion Project (BHPP) is a Sussex wide **project working to improve the** health and wellbeing of people with language needs from diverse ethnic communities.

BHPP will pick up the work of the *Brighton & Hove Health Promotion Project* which ran from 2014-2019 and expand the remit to work with regional partners across Sussex to deliver a common approach. The project will involve working with VCSE partners across Sussex and statutory sector colleagues to develop effective networks, to advise statutory sector partners on approach and to directly provide support to ethnically diverse communities. The project is also key engagement mechanism to ensure that the experiences of ethnically diverse communities are heard, and that members of these communities are supported to participate in developing and improving health and care services.

The need for this work was brought into focus by the Covid-19 pandemic and the health inequalities that contributed to the disproportionately severe effect of the disease on people from diverse ethnic backgrounds.

Governance

The project is managed through the SHCP Public Involvement function, but has clear links to the Health Inequalities workstream, which in turn is part of the Sussex wide Population Health Management and Prevention programme.

- **Engage and empower** ethnically diverse individuals and communities to choose healthy behaviours, and make lifestyle changes that reduce the risk of developing chronic diseases and other morbidities.
- **Support ethnically diverse individuals and communities** to manage additional risk factors that contribute to health inequalities such as poverty, housing, occupation, and education.
- Support ethnically diverse communities to be involved in the work of SHCP at system and place, and to help ensure that the voice of ethnically diverse communities is heard at all levels
